Baylor School, founded in 1893, is an independent, coeducational boarding and day school located in Chattanooga, Tennessee, enrolling 1,083 students in grades six through twelve.

ADMINISTRATION

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THE HONOR CODE is a core value instilled in students from the moment they enter Baylor. A seat on the Honor Council is considered the **most important** position of leadership within the student body.

THE ACADEMIC CALENDAR is organized on a semester system; students in grades 9-12 take six courses each semester.

THE TEACHING FACULTY consists of 58 men and 59 women, 90 of whom hold advanced degrees, of which 17 are on the doctoral level.

CURRICULUM Baylor expects students to enroll in a minimum of 20 units, including 16 academic courses.

English: 4 units
Mathematics: 4 units
Laboratory Sciences: 3 units
Social Sciences: 3 units
Foreign Language: 2 units
Fine Arts: 1 unit

Additional requirements include three years of Physical Education and Wellness.

GRADE POINT AVERAGES Advanced Placement (AP) Courses receive an additional boost to the

course grade (+4 points) as do Honors courses (+2 points). Baylor does not rank. Weighted grades are shown on the transcript and are used for determining GPA. The grading scale is as follows:
A: 90-100 C: 70-79 F: 64 or below
B: 80-89 D: 65-69

GLOBAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM Baylor students must complete five academic pillars including an international travel experience and a digital portfolio in order to earn the Global Scholars designation. The first cohort of Global Scholars will graduate in 2018.

DISCIPLINE POLICY Per Baylor's long-standing policy, the college counselors report a student's dismissal or withdrawal to colleges and universities where supporting materials have been submitted.
